Examiner

The meeting was called to order by Paul at 6:31. The Pledge of Allegiance and a prayer followed.

Minutes

Jean moved and Tim seconded a motion to approve the minutes of the July 10 meeting as presented. The motion was approved.

Treasurer's Report

Derek Alt provided the following report:

Building/Grounds

Derek reported that County Maintenance Manager Melvin Shook looked at the crack in the floor. He has not offered any findings to date. The County Coordinator is looking at funding options.

Derek would like to conduct mold testing in the building. Employees are complaining of headaches, stuffy nose and coughing when in the building. The symptoms subside once they leave. Mold testing was last done in 2020.

Equipment

iPad configuration is still in process.

All county equipment is in service. Derek found a source for free asset tags, so all major equipment is tagged and can be tracked for location and maintenance.

Vehicles

All vehicles are in service with the exception of 376. The key broke off in the ignition and there is no spare key. The board discussed several ways to repair/replace the ignition.

Calls for Service

Paul reported the following calls for service for July:

He noted the calls on the east side of the county are becoming as numerous as on the west side of the county.

Paul also reported the 911 Center is looking to hire two dispatchers.

Training

The Public Training schedule is now on the HCEAA Website. There will be training in CPR, First Aid and Stop the Bleed, monthly on a rotating schedule. There is no enrollment at this time. The Crisis Response Training is scheduled for Sept. 20-22. Commissioner Schetrom said there are 35 slots available and the training is fully funded.

The State is hosting a Pediatric Symposium Sept. 20-Oct 1.

Audit

Nathan reported he is currently in contact with a senior partner of the auditing firm A.A.L. Both 2022 and 2023 audits should be done by the end of August.

County Commission

The County Commission voted to include a tax levy to fund EMS on the November ballot. Two previous attempts to enact an EMS levy were defeated by the voters.

Fran moved and Tim seconded a motion to allow Derek and Nathan to gather information and make presentations of facts to civic, community and religious groups. The motion was approved.

Invoices

Derek presented invoices due in August. Tim moved and Steve seconded a motion to approve payment of the invoices.

Comments

The Wardensville Volunteer Rescue Squad will host a 50th Anniversary celebration on Sunday, Aug. 18 from 1 - 4 p.m.

Derek reported the MOU with Wardensville Rescue Squad is in full effect. He reported the increase in the fuel bill was less than anticipated. There are still some procedural hick-ups with ALS medics.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:16 p.m.
